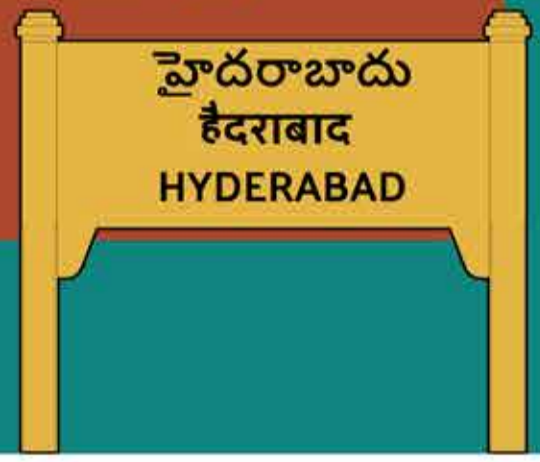

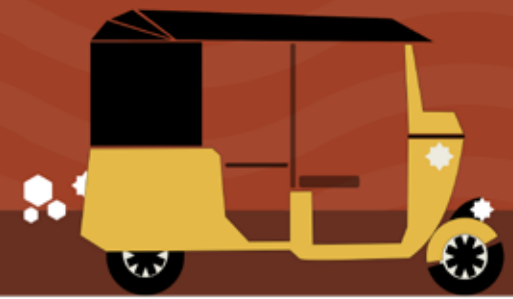

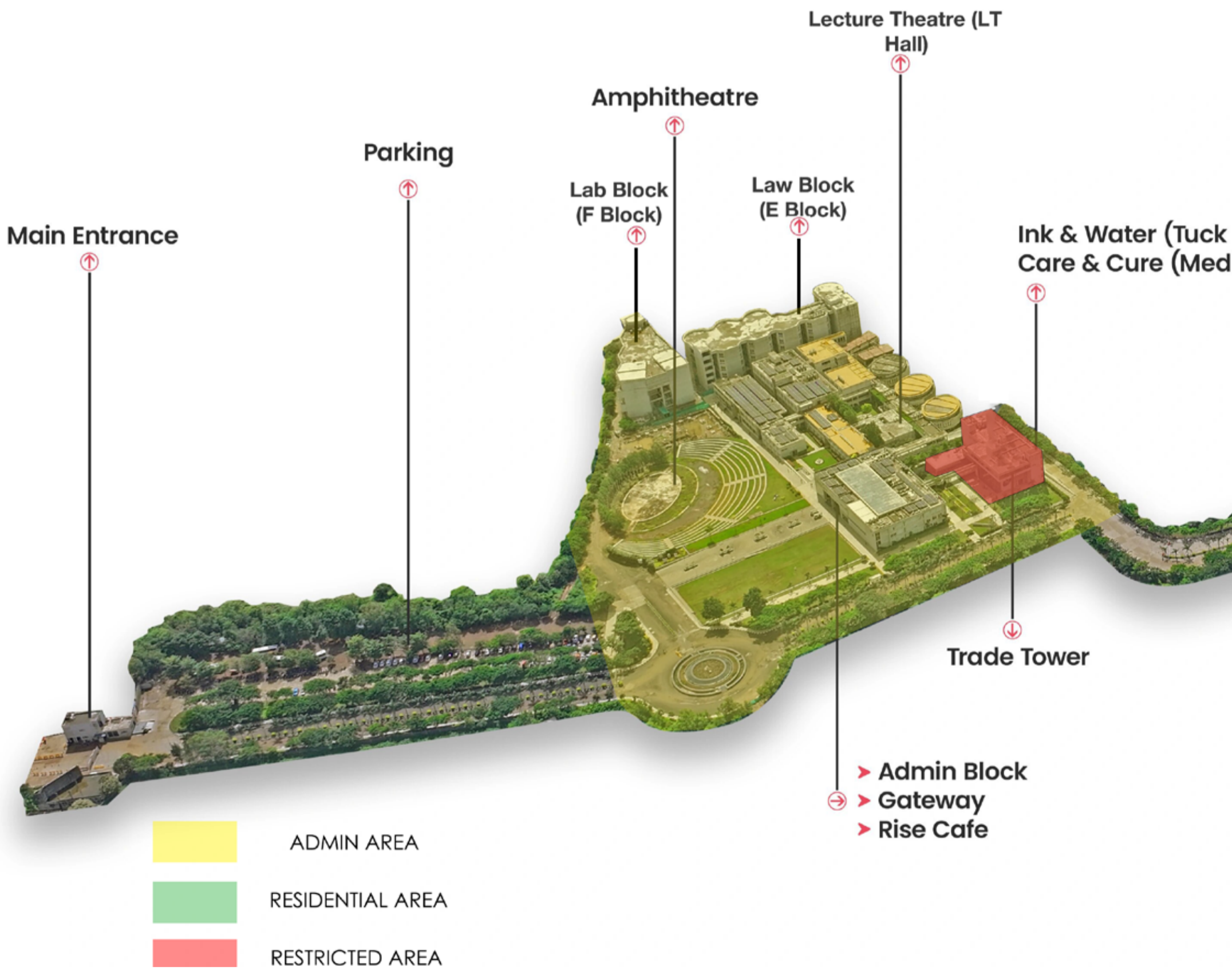

VENUE MAP



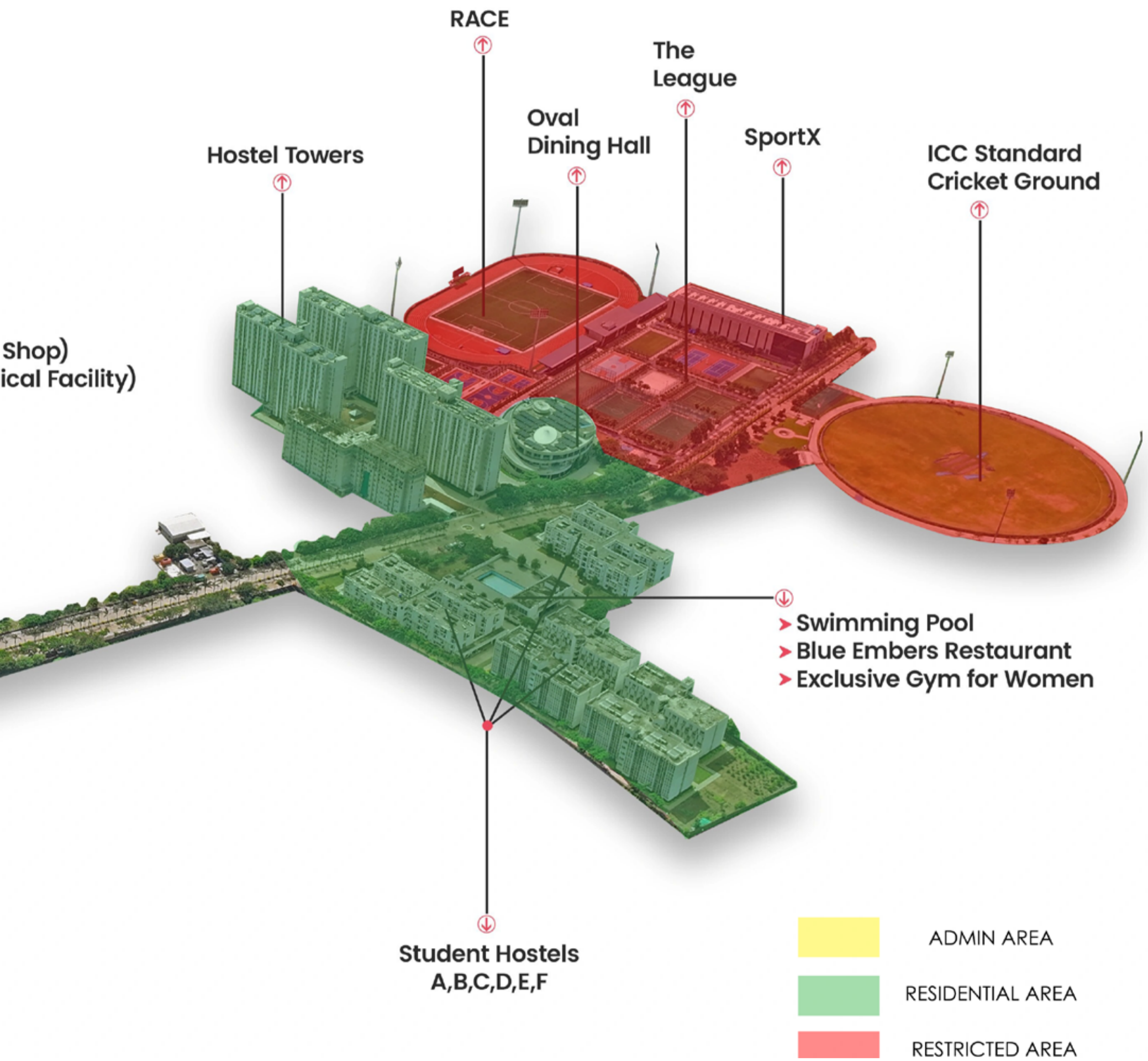

Note:

- Shuttle services will be provided only for delegates who submit transportation details in advance through the registration form.
- Shuttle timings and pickup locations will be communicated prior to the event.
- Buses will operate only from designated pickup points and based on occupancy requirements.
- Metro, cab, and public transportation facilities are publicly available from all major stations and terminals till the bus pickup points.
- For any additional transportation assistance, delegates may contact the transportation team.



REGISTRATION

All delegates registered through their Unit Secretary are required to complete the registration process with their respective Unit Secretary at the Registration Desk. The delegates will receive their wristbands and delegation kits from the unit secretaries.

Non-associated colleges should designate a point of contact (POC) responsible for registering their delegation. The POC will distribute the wristbands and delegation kits to the delegates.

Students who registered directly, such as those in the DET category, must complete the registration process in person at the venue and obtain their wristbands and delegation kits from the registration desk.

In case of any student replacement, the Unit Secretary shall inform the same to the registration desk and need to provide the ID proof for the same.

All the unit secretaries and unit designees should carry the following documents for the security check:

- Original/soft copy of college id card or bonafide letter by HOD for all the delegates.
- Declaration letter signed and stamped by the HOD/Principal/Dean.
- Original govt-issued photo ID proof of all the delegates.
- A caution deposit of each delegate.

Caution Deposit

A caution deposit of INR 500/- in cash must be paid by each delegate, including the Unit Secretary and Unit Designee, at the registration desk. This deposit will be refunded to each unit upon returning the exact number of wristbands and presenting the caution receipt issued to their respective units. The money has to be handed over in cash in an envelope.



SECURITY & SAFETY GUIDELINES

The safety, security, and well-being of all delegates remain a top priority throughout 68th Year ANC. To ensure a secure and comfortable environment for everyone, all participants are expected to comply with the following guidelines.

Security Screening

- All delegates and their belongings will undergo mandatory security screening before entering the campus premises.
- Security personnel reserve the right to inspect bags, luggage, and personal items whenever necessary to ensure campus safety.
- Cooperation during security checks is mandatory for all delegates

Medical Assistance & Emergency Support

- The Host University provides 24/7 medical assistance and emergency support services throughout the event.
- Delegates carrying prescription medication must carry valid medical prescriptions at all times.
- Possession or misuse of medication without proper documentation may result in disciplinary action.

Protection of University Property

Delegates are expected to respect and protect university infrastructure and facilities.

The following may result in financial penalties and deductions from the caution deposit:

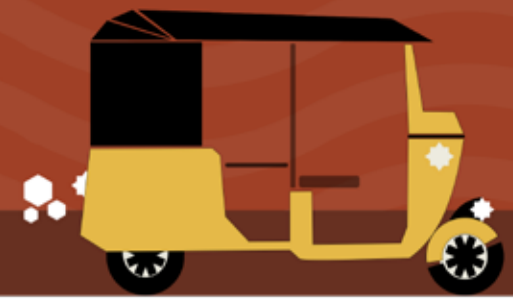
- Damage to buildings, furniture, fixtures, equipment, or accommodation facilities.
- Misuse of university resources or common spaces.
- Tampering with emergency and safety equipment.
- Emergency equipment, including fire extinguishers, alarms, and safety installations, must only be used during genuine emergencies.

Restricted Access & Unauthorized Activities

- Theft, vandalism, trespassing, or unauthorized entry into restricted areas is strictly prohibited.
- Any attempt to access secured facilities without permission may result in disciplinary action, financial penalties, and removal from campus.

Zero-Tolerance Policy

68th Year ANC and the Host University are committed to providing a safe, inclusive, and respectful environment for every participant.



The following behaviors will not be tolerated under any circumstances:

- Violence or physical assault
- Verbal abuse and intimidation
- Harassment of any kind
- Ragging and bullying
- Cyberbullying and online misconduct
- Hate speech and discriminatory behavior
- Sexual harassment
- Body shaming
- Discrimination based on gender, race, religion, caste, language, disability, region, nationality, or personal identity

Any delegate found engaging in such conduct may face:

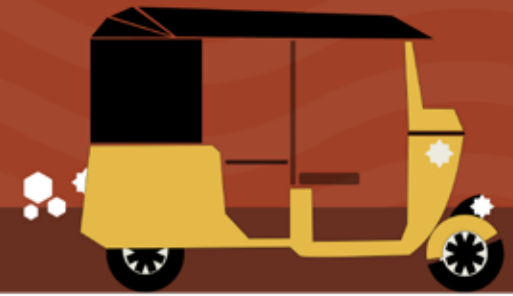
- Immediate removal from campus
- Forfeiture of caution deposit
- Revocation of event privileges and transportation support
- Further action as deemed appropriate by the organizing authorities

Prohibited Items

For the safety of all delegates, possession, use, distribution, or sale of the following items is strictly prohibited within the campus premises:

- Alcohol and tobacco products
- Condoms
- E-cigarettes, vapes, and hookahs
- Illegal drugs and controlled substances
- Weapons and sharp objects
- Explosives, fireworks, and flammable materials
- Hazardous chemicals and toxic substances
- Drones and unauthorized surveillance devices
- Hacking tools, signal jammers, and cyber-interference equipment
- Unauthorized electrical appliances and equipment
- Personal vehicles
- Outside food and beverages
- Any item considered dangerous, disruptive, or harmful to campus safety

The Host University reserves the right to confiscate prohibited items and take appropriate disciplinary action whenever necessary.



ACCOMMODATION GUIDELINES

Accommodation for delegates will be available from:

to

15 June 2026 | 10:00 AM

Accommodation once allotted to a delegate shall be considered final, and requests for room changes will not be entertained.

Items to Bring

Delegates are required to bring their own:

- Extension cord / multi-plug
- Bedsheets
- Blankets
- Toiletries
- Personal hygiene kits
- Safety locks for luggage and rooms
- **Pillow**
- **Umbrella**

A bed with mattress will be provided.

Personal Belongings

Delegates are solely responsible for the safety and security of their personal belongings. The Host University, Organizing Committee, and NASA India Council shall not be held responsible for any loss, theft, or damage to personal property.

Accommodation Regulations

- No male delegate will be permitted to enter the female accommodation area and vice versa, except for authorized Host Committee members and Security Heads in emergency situations.
- Delegates are not permitted to leave the campus premises under any circumstances during the event. In case of an emergency, the NASA India Council must be informed immediately.
- NASA India Council shall not be responsible for any actions undertaken by delegates outside the campus premises.
- Delegates are expected to maintain their accommodation spaces responsibly and respectfully throughout their stay.



Room Allocation & Inspections

- Infrastructure-related complaints must be reported within 15 minutes of room allocation.
- Changing, exchanging, or switching rooms without authorization is strictly prohibited.
- Periodic room inspections will be conducted by the Security Team in the presence of delegates and relevant authorities.
- Any prohibited or unauthorized material discovered during inspections will be confiscated immediately, and strict disciplinary action may be taken against the concerned delegate and/or institution.

Food will be served only during the designated timings. Delegates who fail to report during meal hours may not be provided food.

Food Coupons

- All delegates must carry their food coupons during meal timings.
- Failure to present a valid food coupon may result in a fine as determined by the Organizing Committee.

Waste Management & Sustainability

All delegates are requested to support the event's sustainability initiatives by:

- Practicing proper waste segregation.
- Disposing of waste only in designated collection points.
- Maintaining cleanliness in dining and common areas.

Drinking Water Facilities

To minimize waste generation:

- Delegates must carry their own reusable water bottles.
- Drinking water dispensers will be available across the venue.
- Disposable cups and glasses will not be provided.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

To ensure a safe, enjoyable, and well-organized experience for everyone, all delegates are required to comply with the regulations established by the NASA India Council and the Host University throughout the duration of **68th Year ANC**.

Entry, Exit & Campus Movement

- Once delegates enter the campus, **they are not permitted** to leave until the event officially concludes.
- Delegates from the same institution must enter and exit the campus together and may not leave independently.
- **Personal vehicles are strictly prohibited** within the campus premises, including parking areas.
- Delegates are not permitted to remain on campus after the official conclusion of event activities.
- **If an emergency necessitates leaving the campus, delegates are required to immediately notify the NASA Council and secure written permission prior to departure.**

Delegate Identification

- Every delegate will receive an official event wristband upon arrival.
- The wristband serves as the delegate's identification and access pass throughout the convention.
- **Delegates must wear their wristband at all times.**
- Loss, damage, exchange, or failure to wear the wristband may result in disciplinary action, including full deduction of the caution deposit

Sustainability & Accommodation

As part of Woxsen University's commitment to sustainability, delegates are expected to:

- **Dispose of waste responsibly and avoid littering.**
- Conserve electricity and water whenever possible.
- Use designated pathways and avoid walking on lawns or landscaped areas.

Conduct & Behavior

ANC is built on mutual respect, professionalism, and responsible conduct. Therefore

- **Public displays of affection and inappropriate conduct are not permitted.**
- Encouraging or participating in prohibited activities will invite disciplinary action
- Delegates must treat fellow participants, volunteers, faculty, staff, and university property with respect at all times.

Personal Belongings

Delegates are solely responsible for the safety of their personal belongings, including:

- Cash
- Mobile phones
- Laptops and electronic devices
- Jewelry and other valuables

The Host University and NASA India Council shall not be held liable for any loss, theft, or damage to personal property during the event.

Compliance & Cooperation

By entering the campus and participating in 68th Year ANC, delegates agree to uphold the values of discipline, integrity, responsibility, and mutual respect. All delegates are expected to cooperate fully with the Host University authorities, NASA India Council representatives, volunteers, and organizing committee members throughout the convention.



HEALTH & HYGIENE

- Delegates must carry their own water bottles and hand sanitizers at all times.
- During ANC, if a delegate notices any change in their health condition, it must be reported to the medical team immediately.
- Sanitary pads should be only disposed of in sanitary dustbins placed in the washrooms.
- All the diabetic students please bring your insulin covered in a box so that respective names of the person can be written on the box and stored safely in a fridge.
- Medicine will only be allowed with prescription. Doctor's prescription report should be provided by the delegates at the time of registration.

EVENT RULES

To ensure fair participation and the smooth conduct of all events, delegates are required to adhere to the following guidelines.

- The rules, regulations, and decisions established by the Organizing Committee for all events shall be considered final. Any disputes, objections, or requests for clarification during the convention may not be entertained.
- Participation in any event will be permitted only after successful registration through the official registration link provided by the Host College.
- Delegates are responsible for bringing their own stationery and any personal materials required for participation, unless otherwise specified.
- Registration for events will be conducted on a first-come, first-served basis, subject to the participant limits prescribed for each event.
- **Delegates must wear their official event wristbands at all times.** Participants without valid wristbands will not be permitted to take part in any event.
- Delegates are expected to maintain professionalism, discipline, and decorum at all event venues. **Any misconduct, disruption, or inappropriate behavior by an individual or institution may result in disciplinary action and may be reported to the Zonal and Executive Council of NASA India.**
- During competitions, participants must not communicate with individuals who are not registered participants of the same event unless expressly permitted by the event coordinators. Violation of this rule may lead to disqualification.
- Participants are expected to report to the venue on time. No additional time, extensions, or special consideration will be granted for late arrivals.



WORKSHOPS

- It is mandatory for all the delegates to attend the days of workshop they have registered for.
- Materials that are specified to be carried by the attendee of the workshop must be brought without fail.
- Laptops/ camera/ ipad must be carried for the workshops that specify it.
- Materials provided by the host college for any workshop must be handled with care.
- These materials must not leave the workshop premises at any time.
- For workshops that extend beyond one day, these materials will be collected at the end of the day and returned to the students at the start of the workshop the following day.
- Attendance for the workshop attendees will be taken on all the days of the workshop.
- The attendance will be taken twice, once during the morning session and again during the evening session.
- E-certificates will be issued exclusively to students who remain present until the workshop's conclusion.
- The attendees must be on time for the workshops and any form of disrespect towards the tutor will not be tolerated.

NEXUS EVENTS

- Major nexus events will be held on the ground floor itself.
- In case of unfavourable climatic conditions outdoor events will be rescheduled or relocated.
- The instructions regarding the spot events shall be announced by the event volunteers.
- Registrations for the spot events will be held one hour before the event begins.
- The participants count for each event are limited, and registration operates strictly on a first-come, first-serve basis.

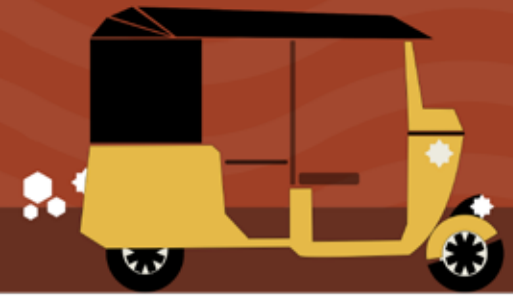

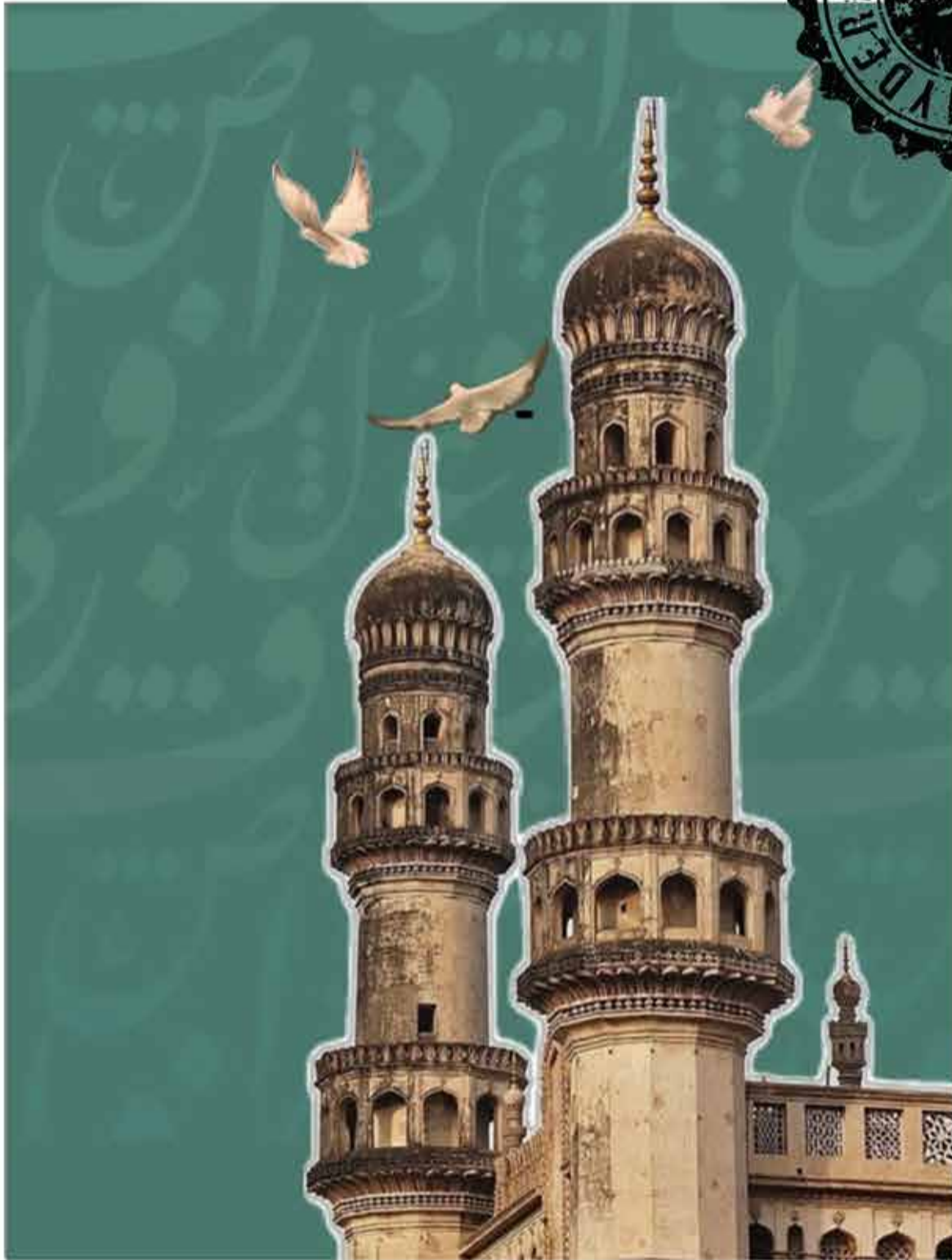
